TR TECH

TR6/TR7 Choke Cables

TR6 and TR7 choke cables frequently have the cable sleeves push out of the base inside the car. I have seen this happen with almost new cables. So instead of spending \$150 for a new cable, I repair it by slipping the cables back into the base. Then split a section of fuel hose and hose clamp it. They never come loose again.

Bad Time To Lose Your Lights...

Ed Note: Karl sent out the following email as a follow up to Creig Houghtaling's tech tip, "A burned-out dash bulb can cause your alternator to quit charging" (*Exhaust Notes*, July 2024, pg 10).

On the way home last Thursday evening, in the dark, my red alternator charging light glowed faintly. Oh-oh, potential alternator problem, 20 miles from home, in the dark on narrow country roads. Definitely not good! But, I did make it home, quickly, as I ignored the posted speed limits

Next day, I found the alternator/water pump drive belt to be on the loose side, so I snugged it up a bit (never make this belt real tight, as you will overload the pump and alternator bearings).

Next up, start the motor. Nope, would not start, not ever sputter. I added raw fuel to the carburetor, nothing. My gear reduction starter will really will spin the motor, nothing. OK, fuel is probably not the problem. Other

side of motor and started looking at my traditional "points" type ignition system. Pushed and pulled all the wires, and whoops, the wire from the coil to the distributer points terminal pulled free. It had separated at the stake on terminal fitting.

I replaced the stake-on, reconnected it to the terminal, and started the motor. It ran fine, so I was done. Same for the alternator: the red light was out and volt meter indicated a healthy charge to the battery.

Long and short of it! Some 40 years ago, when I first rebuilt my ignition system, I installed stake-on fittings at all terminal connections for ease of maintenance. Best guess today, back when I stripped the insulation from the wire, I nicked the copper wire strands a bit. This is a no-no, and I should know better. So, after all these years of wiggling and shaking while driving, the copper wire strands finally separated.

Not a fun thing to do on a narrow country road, in the dark! But I do love these LBCs.

TR7 Footwell Vents

If you are like me, anything over 50 degrees is good top-down driving weather, albeit with earmuffs and gloves. But what about our Georgia summer months?

As with my Spitfire before, my TR7 gets a bit toasty when the temperature is above 80 degrees. With the Spit, an insulating mat covering the transmission tunnel cover cooled things down, somewhat. Later model TR7/8s were shipped to the USA with factory installed air conditioning.

My TR7 like many others had the A/C removed by the previous owner (it's lurking in my basement with its York compressor the size of a Briggs & Stratton lawn mower engine). With no interest in recommissioning the A/C system, I have been searching for other ways to make the car more comfortable in the summer.

Thanks to numerous blogs, I learned that non-A/C cars shipped to Europe and elsewhere were equipped with footwell vents! I have fond memories of my mother's 1960 Pontiac Catalina station wagon's (with a 389 V8 I might add) cooling footwell vents activated by a cable attached to a knob under the dash. Could this be the solution to my toasted tootsies?



The aforementioned blogs revealed that ALL TR7/8's were built with the footwell vents with the A/C cars utilizing a POP riveted blocking plate behind the kick panel to render the vents inoperable. While the OEM YKC566 vents (pictured, black) were NLA, TS Imports offered their version fabricated in stainless steel (pictured S/S).



I proceeded to acquire a pair and after some fiddling, trial and error and some contorted body positions, I now have cool air at my feet with a touch of a finger(s). Bring on those 90-degree days!

The E83W-model van came out of Ford's Dagenham East, London, factory as an export model with left-hand drive; Ford produced them from 1938 through 1957, including station wagon (hmmm...a Brit Suburban?) and pickup truck variants. A 1.2L 30 bhp provided the power (so to speak) to the rear axle via a 3-speed manual.

According to the seller, "Overall condition is very good, a tiny bit of rust behind the rear wheel on the driver's side in back...the last time I had it running was 2019, but it will fire up for you with some either or some gas down the carb and put a jump box in, it runs very good, actually.

The van—located in Salem, Oregon—was on Craigslist with a \$9900 asking price.

Exciting Changes for 2024 Lake Garnett Grand Prix Revival

Registration for the <u>2024 Lake Garnett Grand Prix Revival</u> is open and we've got some exciting news! We've made some changes to the event segments for this year that will provide more options for track time.

First and foremost, all event segments are à la carte and all track groups will have sessions on BOTH Saturday and Sunday. You can participate in as many or as few as you like, on one or both days (full-competition Groups E & V are the exception as they are still two-day groups). Let's go through the changes:

REGISTRATION - OPENING EARLIER

Registration will now open at 6:30am on Saturday and Sunday, hopefully allowing a little more time for participants to get their registration packages, get their cars in place, and get themselves to the driver meetings.

GROUP R - Rookie - 60 MPH

This group is still for 16-17 year old drivers and 1st timers only, and is limited to 60 MPH. As in previous years, drivers in this group must be accompanied by an instructor / guardian / parent (over age 30) who will help ensure that track rules are followed. However, in 2024 Group R will run concurrently with Group A, so be aware of this if you are planning on sharing a car with another driver. We will be separating the two groups on the grid and rolling Group A out first. The biggest benefit to all this is that Group R drivers now can run on Sunday as well!

GROUP A - 60 MPH

We've added Group A sessions on Saturday this year. Group A will run concurrently with Group R, so be aware of this if you are planning on sharing a car with another driver. We will be separating the two groups on the grid and rolling Group A out first.

GROUP B - 80 MPH

We've added Group B sessions on Saturday this year.

GROUP X – 100 MPH: REDESIGNATED AS GROUP C
The Saturday 100 MPH previously known as Group X has been redesignated as Group C, the same as it is on Sunday.

GROUP H - HISTORIC

Group H still has one session on each day, but participants can now select to run on one or both days, and the entry fee has been adjusted accordingly.

AUTOCROSS

No changes to the Saturday morning autocross format for 2024, but be aware that if you are running any Saturday track sessions, you cannot also run the autocross. You'll need to choose one or the other.

FRIDAY TOUR & CRUISE – CANCELLED

Due to waning participation in recent years, we've elected to cancel the organized road tour.

One thing to note is that while we are adding the additional track groups to the Saturday portion, they have only 50% of the



capacity compared to Sunday (when we have B1/B2, C1/C2, etc.), SO IT'S IMPERATIVE THAT YOU REGISTER EAR-LY IF YOU WANT TO RUN SATURDAY as those groups will sell out fast!

And don't forget that any entry into either the autocross or a track session gets you FREE ENTRY to the Saturday car show on the square!




