Treasurer



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ODD HEGBERG'S GRAND ADVENTURE

The summer issue provided a short introduction to one of TWOA's more distant members, Odd Hedberg of Sweden ("Prelude," *The Bulletin*, Summer 2024). Odd decided to attend the 2024 VTR National in Indiana, including the Wedge reunion and flew in from Sweden to assist Jim TenCate with getting his two Wedges to Nashville, Indiana.

We'll let Dave Massey—with an assist from Jim—pick up the story there, concerning the drive back post-convention.

Last issue you read about the start of Odd Hedberg's Most Excellent Adventure. It's the "Prelude" on page 14 in case you missed it. Chapter 1 (not included here) of this adventure explains Jim's plans to get his two wedge-shaped cars to VTR Nationals. We'll spare you most of the details (it's a long story) but these: the original plan was for Jim to stage his platinum TR8 at his mum's in Michigan after the South Central Regionals. That all went as expected. He flew back home to NM and immediately started working on Blj, an Aran Beige TR8, to get it roadworthy (Blj is Klingon for "Punishment").

A week before VTR Nationals, Odd was to fly into Chicago from Stockholm via Iceland and then either Amtrak to Jim's mum or Jim would pick him up at O'Hare Airport. That would give Odd about a week to undo jetlag and them to do any last minute fixing on the three cars (Jim's brother's TR7, and his two TR8s). It didn't happen that way. Suffice it to say, Jim underestimated just how many weird and bizarre issues Blj would throw at him. Blj was grounded finally with another gas tank seal leak and some evidence mice had chewed on wiring. Plan B had been for Jim to take his daily driver instead, the Triumph support vehicle his daughter named Max.

Chapter 2 of Odd's story is all about the goings on at VTR Nationals and you've already read reports about that as well. This is the story of what happened afterwards!

Chapter 3. Nashville, Indiana to White Rock, New Mexico.

Day 1: A group of four intrepid travelers left Nashville under threatening skies. Our band of merry men was comprised of Dave Massey in his green TR8, Odd Hedberg in the white Tesla Model 3 (Max), Jim TenCate in the Platinum TR8 and Jeremy Dearing in the white TR6.

All fueled up, the Triumphs were ready to make St. Louis. The electric car, however required a stop halfway.



The forecast for rain was about 50% but the roads and the skies remained dry all the way to just short of Terre Haute. Then the skies opened up. This was also the end of the blue-line highway and we were forced to use the interstate (I-70) for about 12 miles. Once safely into Illinois we were able to leave the interstate and utilize Old Highway 40. Highway 40 is the historic National Road which was first built in the early 19th century. This road connected Baltimore, Maryland and St. Louis, MO. It was also referred to as the Cumberland Road as it passed through the Cumberland Gap.

Interstate 70 was built to parallel Highway 40 which means traffic on 40 is light and almost entirely local. Local except for four small British cars (well, three and a wanna-be). Also, the rain lightened up and cleared up pretty shortly, too.

A calm, leisurely drive through corn and sorghum fields led us to Effingham and the location of a Tesla supercharger where Max was juiced up and the drivers enjoyed a well deserved mid-day repast. After lunch we continued on Highway 40 to Vandalia, the first capital of Illinois. With a brief stop to see the fire breathing dragon we proceeded on, avoiding the interstate as much as possible. An interesting note is that Max kept insisting on diverting onto the interstate and Odd had to repeatedly override Max's decision to change course. Most of the fast charging available is still only near Interstates.

Once reaching O'Fallon, Illinois it became mandatory to return to the interstate. I-55/I-70 led us to St. Louis and we took the 3rd St. Exit which led us to the historic Eads Bridge, the first structural steel bridge of its size ever built. It is also the first bridge built across the Mississippi River south of the confluence with the Missouri River. Earlier bridges crossed the river up north where the river is more narrow but none of these have survived to the present day making the Eads Bridge, which opened in 1874, the oldest bridge to cross the Mississippi River. This also lead us to recommended parking for our visit to the gateway arch.



Construction of the Gateway Arch started in 1962 and was completed in 1967. It is symbolic of the role St. Louis played in the settling of the western United States. It is a catenary arch 630 feet (192 M) tall and 630 feet (192 M) wide at the base. A catenary arch has the same shape as a chain suspended from both ends. All the elements are in compression (or tension in the case of a chain) and there are no shear forces. This makes for a light, yet robust design that can withstand a storm with wind speeds up to 150 MPH (240 KPH). There is a tram that takes visitors to the top to see the view of St. Louis and surroundings from this high vantage point. Due to the circular path taken by the tram the cars, which seat five, are equipped with a leveling system that will keep the cars in a horizontal orientation as the tram follows the arch on its way up the leg of the arch. In the base of the arch there is a museum featuring the history and development of St. Louis and the region. The Arch closes at 6:00 PM, just as rush hour is finishing up. This made a good time for the short dash to Dave's house where Odd, Jim and Dave spent the night.

Day 2: St. Louis to Salina, Kansas. This was a long day of driving but time still allowed us to pay a long visit to the National WWI Museum in Kansas City. This edifice serves as both a memorial for the fallen soldiers and a history lesson. Opened in 1926, this museum does a deep dive into the events that lead up to the war and how it transpired. A lot of the "facts" that I had previously held about the war proved to be either mistaken or grossly over-simplified. They also house a vast repository of documents where one can research the contributions of a family member, and Jim took advantage

of this feature and uncovered some lost history of his grandfather who served near Verdun and into parts of Luxembourg. Well worth the diversion if you are ever in the Kansas City area. After the museum visit we pressed on westward to Salina where we spent the night.


Day 3: Salina to Colorado Springs.

Another long drive with no particular visits along the



way. At the recharge point in Hayes, KS, Odd and Dave decided they wanted to leave the interstate and follow Highway 40. This route looked more direct and less heavily traveled. Jim, however, needed to keep to the interstate highway because that is where the fast recharge stations are located. Odd and Dave found Highway 40 to be straight and almost devoid of traffic. The clear, warm weather made for a pleasant drive. That is until we encountered the "Road Closed 6 Miles Ahead" sign. The detour sign had us make a right turn and after 20 minutes we found ourselves in Goodland, KS, at the Supercharger Jim had visited only a few minutes earlier. Odd and Dave caught up with Jim at the next Supercharger in Limon, Colorado.

From there we proceeded to Colorado Springs in time for a quick tour of the Garden of the Gods park, known for the impressive rock formations. Plutonic uplift, volcanic activity and erosion have produced an impressive display of rock projections towering above the surrounding forest. This Colorado City park is free to visitors and well attended. It is also on the way from Colorado City to Pikes Peak.




Day 4: Colorado City, Colorado to White Rock, New Mexico.

After spending the night in Colorado City our first order was to climb Pikes Peak. But, since Garden of the Gods is on the route another quick visit was in order. The difference in the lighting between afternoon and morning is striking and the park warrants two visits just for that reason.

Then off to conquer the peak. Jim is seeking bragging rights and drove the TR8 to the peak. One would think that

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
the name should be Pike's Peak as it was discovered by Zebulon Pike and hence the possessive is in order here but at some point the apostrophe was dropped, perhaps to save ink or maybe just out of laziness (one less type to set) so all references to it say Pikes Peak. The Tesla indicated about 200 miles of range at the bottom but that had dropped to 110 miles once the peak was achieved. The peak clocks in at 14,115 ft (4302 m) and has a visitors' center that is warm, offers great views and is also the terminus of the cog rail that serves as an alternate means to the peak for those either reluctant to drive the highway or wish an alternative experience.

The peak is also where the clutch hydraulics on Jim's TR8 completely failed. So, Jim was presented with the task of descending the mountain and driving the 300+ miles home. A flatbed down was reported to be prohibitively expensive (nearly \$1k according to some reports). Therefore, the trip down the mountain was done in second gear. Needless to say the brake check halfway down was passed with flying colors by both cars (the Tesla was waved through without even a check.) Upon reaching the bottom of the mountain Max was now indicting about 163 miles of range. Regenerative braking recovered about 53 miles of range descending the mountain. By hook or by crook, Jim's TR8 made it to his driveway under its own power. More next time...


Craig-

ADMIT IT, YOU WANT THIS CAR



Once again, in late January Barn Finds (https://barnfinds.com/) came through with another outstanding opportunity for the LBC-Centric individual: a 1959 Berkeley B65. As summarized by author Brian K, the Berkeley would serve well as "a sporty runabout that will turn heads and offer you wind-in-the-hair during the summer months..."





He noted the company produced about 4100 cars between 1956 and 1960 at its facility in Biggleswade, Bedfordshire, England. All hit the street with motorcycle engines, ranging in displacement from 322 to 692cc

sending power to the front wheels via a chain assembly. Power? The 322cc engine, as found in this '59 example B65, generated, oh, 15 bhp, good for a top speed of about 60 mph.

The car went up for sale in Hawthorne, California, on the southwest side of Los Angeles. Asking price was \$3000; obviously, it required a complete restoration, hence the reference to the Berkeley Enthusiasts Club. What would the finished car look like? Probably something like this Berkeley 95, which went on display at the annual All British Car & Cycle Show in September 2009.

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THEY'RE ALL WORKS IN PROGRESS

Stephen Paur – Four projects: one's done, one's 90 percent and the others are getting finished. I hit the bonanza as my wife and kids bought LED headlights and dash lights for the TR6, I no longer drive by candlelight. I also installed a custom AM/FM radio with Blue Tooth and a jack. I also replaced by turn signal switch.

Pat Kasate - Nothing to report right now.

Dave Massey – I put a new radio in the Wedge. The stock radio sticks out so I bought a new one without cassette player but it has Blue Tooth. It's now flush. I also noticed the windows were hard to roll up and down, found the track at the forward end of the glass was bent, worked on that. Also, taking advantage of the cold weather, I'm working on the cold start function with my Mega Squirt injection system. Otherwise, I'm preparing for an engine swap. The engine in the car is a flood survivor and runs good but it blows oil (question from the floor: "Do you need your driveway cleaned?").

Mark Morgan – Plans for the spring, in advance of the start of autocross seasons: replace the brake vacuum booster with a newer unit, courtesy of Dave Massey. Also, adjust the engine idle, change the oil, new plugs and install new spark plug wires.

David Pollard – My TR6 is sitting in David Yannayon's garage. We're doing the wiring harness, have ordered a new one. My brother made a burl walnut dash, hope to install it after Polar Bear. I also ordered a rebuilt water pump from Flying Dutchman. I sent in the old one but for some reason it disappeared in the mail system, had to reorder.
