

### **New Business**



### BACKWARDS GLANCE-THE BOND EQUIPE GT

You gotta love the British; over the past 100-plus years, their manufacturers have turned out a fair number of truly, uh, "unique" cars (same thing with aircraft, but that's a story for another venue). Possibly some of the most famous marques were the Brit three-wheeler cars, such as Morgans, which went into production in 1911.

Post World War II, with Britain recovering from World War II and the economy staggering, a number of other three-wheel designs came to the fore. The premise behind the vehicles was simple: cheap, economical to operate and possibly most importantly, taxed as a motorcycle and not as a four-wheel automobile. They used motorcycle engines as their power plants and usually didn't offer a reverse gear.

In 1948, Lawrence "Lawrie" Bond of Preston, Lancashire built his first three-wheeler, powered by a Villiers 250cc two-stroke engine. Sharp's Commercials Ltd started production of his designs the following, commencing with the Mark A; remarkably, that initial design proved quite popular and continued to roll out of the factory until 1966. According to automotive writer/historian Doug Nye, the cars

...attracted a small but fanatically enthusiastic band of owners – the self-styled "Bondoliers" – although the attractions of the motorcycle-inspired three-wheelers were not obvious to anyone who has travelled in them. They are noisy, shakey and a little unstable...they were very much a throw-back to the vintage days.

A number of additional models followed, but in 1963 Bond set his sights on something more traditional: a four-wheel car named the Equipe GT 2+2. It debuted at the 1963 London Motor Show at Earls Court; the company's press release pushed the vehicle as "...Britain's new, family priced GT car."

The car employed a Triumph Herald chassis with Triumph's twin SU HS2 carburetor 1147cc engine up front, good for 63 bhp and 82 mph. The cars also utilized the Herald's windshield and doors, along with a fiberglass

fastback body. The bodies were fabricated at one Sharp's Commercial plant in Preston, with final assembly at a factory on Ribbleton Lane, also in Preston.

Drawbacks? At £822 (about \$2300), the Bond GT was rather pricey and, despite being a 2+2, anyone who went into the back seat had to be rather short, due to limited leg and headroom. In addition, there was no trunk lid so you had to load your baggage via the passenger compartment. And yes, the GT handled like a Herald.

On the plus side, Triumph not only provided the chassis, suspension, transmission and engine, but the company also agreed to sell the GTs at selected dealerships. Per Graham Robson, "The Equipe was a nice enough little car, and befitted by being sold through selected Triumph dealers with a good guarantee and an ideal spares situation, but once again it was expensive and sold in small numbers."

In any event, in 1964, the management at Sharp's Commercials formally changed the corporate name to Bond Cars Limited. That same year, Bond produced the upgraded Equipe GT4S, with a substantially modified body that gave back seat passengers some measure of relief, as well as a proper trunk. The restyled front end looked vaguely like an early-generation Spitfire, albeit with four headlights. The GT4S 1300 followed in 1967, powered by the 1296cc 75 bhp engine from the Spitfire Mk III. The car also featured larger front brakes and improvements to the rear suspension.

The ultimate Equipe came out in 1967, the 2-Litre or "GT Sports Saloon." The car was all new, employing a Triumph Vitesse chassis and the 1998cc straight six, backed by a four-speed all synchromesh transmission and good for 100 mph. Trevor Fiore did the styling of the "Italian inspired" body; the interior featured a Vitesse dash with more gauges, a Vitesse back seat and a wood -rimmed steering wheel. Options included a radio, heated rear window, wire wheels and Laycock de Normanville overdrive. Bond followed in 1968 with the Mk II convertible: all of the 2000s gained a modified rear suspension which reduced tuck-under during serious cornering.

Ah, but the end was in sight. In 1968, the Dutton-Forshaw Group acquired the Loxhams & Bradshaw Group of companies, which included Bond. However, Dutton-Forshaw declined to include Bond in the acquisition. Management attempted to buy the auto manufacturer but failed and, in February 1969, Reliant - another noted three-wheeled vehicle manufacturer - purchased

Apparently, Reliant's intent was to tap into Bond. Bond's arrangement with Triumph, including sales, but British Leyland, undergoing one of its periodic restructurings, ended the standing agreement for Triumph to sell (and presumably, maintain) Bond vehicles.



The last Bond in production was the Bug three-wheeler, designed by Ogle and fabricated using a Reliant chassis and running gear. The Preston plants turned out a small number of Bond Bug (photo via Silodrome) Equipes prior to closure



of the factories in December 1970, some six months after the introduction of the Bug. Production of the latter at Reliant's Tamworth, Staffordshire factory continued until 1974; it's demise also marked the end of the Bond marque.



### Bluetooth in the TR6

I decided to buy a Bluetooth adaptor for the new radio in the TR6. I purchased a \$26.99 item from Amazon, installed it yesterday and it was so easy to install. The sound quality is great off my iPhone.

I just plugged in the RCA plugs into the accessory adapter on the back of the radio, pigtailed the power wire into the radio's power wire, and attached the ground wire to the radio grand strap. Instead of using screws to attach it under the dash, I just used Velcro to hang it under the dash.

My GT6+ is driving me crazy! The gearbox leaks, it rattles and makes other strange noises, it won't idle correctly, it uses oil the differential is howling, it makes horrible grinding noises going into second gear, it overheats, the valve train sounds like a horde of locusts, it's hot inside, the gauges don't work, the speedometer jumps between 0 100, the tach is off and it won't start when it's below 50 degrees.

I was jacking my TR6 to change a tire and the jack went right through the frame. Is this a problem?

### **Dear Worried:**

Relax! This is perfectly normal for a TR6. They go through a unique aging process that changes the steel

frame into a substance very similar to eggshells. While this may sound bad, it is easily corrected.

Simply take your car to a welding shop, where they will weld in a complex network of angle iron that will rival modern sculpture in complexity. When it's done your car will be 1000 pounds heavier and the jack will still probably go through the frame.
