

ADMIT IT, YOU WANT THIS CAR

Third week of May and what should appear on *Barn Finds* (https://barnfinds.com), but this Mini mod (mod'd Mini?): a 1980 Midas Bronze. Manufactured in kit form by D&H Fiberglass Techniques (later Midas Cars, Ltd.) of Oldham, Manchester, the vehicle was the follow-on to the Mini Marcos. D&H acquired production rights of the Mini Marcos from Marcos in 1975, redesigned it and this was the result.

The cars featured a steel and GRP body, with the Mini's engine, trans and subframe up front and a modified rear suspension. The manufacturer claimed a top speed of 100 mph with 0-to-60 in 9.9 seconds. It came with rear seats; per Barn Finds, this worked "...so long as the back seat passengers are children or gymnastically flexible, or both." Concerning the vehicle's small size, the writer added, "Do you picture yourself traversing today's world of giant pickup trucks, SUVs and 5000 lb Teslas in this composite mini-powered Midas?" Still, who doesn't love the original Mini, or any of the fair number of modified versions which hit British roads over the years?

Anyway, this one came up for sale in Nashville, Tennessee (hmmm...not all that far from here), at a price of \$7500. No word on sale but obviously, a Midas Bronze or other Mini-related vehicle would be a big hit at the annual ABCCS.

JS Performance Motoring (JSPM) Oil Filter Adaptor for GT6/TR6 – Fumoto Oil Drain Valve

I had attempted to install the available old style hanging spin-on oil filter adapter conversion but could never get the device to seal properly. In many years I had never had any issues with leakage from the stock canister but was overjoyed to find that there was a new adapter option provided by JS Performance Motoring (https://jspmparts.com/).

This redesign of the hanging type filter adapter positions the oil filter in the same area as the stock canister filter. It addresses differences in the outer oil seal groove for some engine blocks leading to oil leaks with the old-style adapter.

The JS Performance adapter is high quality and was easy to install. It provides for a good selection of spin-on filters including the option to use larger diameter filters. The kit provided by JSPM included everything needed: adapter, gaskets, and a well written installation instruction document. This item is available from The Roadster Factory or JSPM.

I installed the adapter and finished an oil change on my 1976 TR6 in about an hour and a half including putting in a new Fumoto oil drain valve. Though the instructions were very detailed, I was also helped by a good Gruesome's Garage video (https://youtu.be/N8bkgB5QJFc?

<u>si=aJgwmW-AHkcl_HsU</u>) on YouTube demonstrating the installation of the new adapter on a GT6.

After the installation, I did not experience any leaks and on startup, oil pressure came up very quickly. The only issue encountered was the tight squeeze getting the new spin-on filter on. Last year I had to replace the rear brake line connected to the brake pressure differential warning assembly. (PDWA). The new line extended further from the frame than the original factory brake line, making it a little challenging to fit the filter onto the adapter.

To prevent my annual oil spillage on the garage floor from the oil change, I decided to install a Fumoto engine oil drain valve with a drain tube nipple. This valve, part number F110N (3/8 -18NPT) for the TR6, allows a tube to be attached to easily drain your dirty oil without the splash or stained forearms and hands into a container of choice. A secure valve locking system is integrated into the valve, if does not extend below the bottom of the oil pan, and with millions sold, it is a mature and well tested upgrade. The valve for the TR6 is not listed on the https://www.fumotousa.com/ website but was provided by a quick and pleasant call to the vendor. These are available from Moss, but you can buy them directly from Fumoto for less than \$40.

Both these vendors were very good to work with and provide high quality products and in the future, I will not dread making oil changes.





SOUTH CENTRAL VTR 2025—AUTOCROSS TALES

As mentioned last issue, Dave Massey and Jeremy Dearing won their classes in the South Central VTR autocross, held in Bellmead, Texas. Ah, but according to the host club, the Red River Valley Triumph Club, some additional effort was involved in preparing the autocross course. Here's RRTC member TD Hathcock's writeup and photos, from the May issue of the Red River Ramblings.

Autocross Setup Challenge

When setting up the Autocross and Funkhana tracks, we found there were three cars that were left in the parking lot after a concert in the same place the night before. Calling the police did not help, and I don't think anyone wanted to pay a wrecker to move them. So, there was a stop at Harbor Freight to pick up a set of car dollies, then the low profile big floor jacks came out and the guys started lifting the car wheel by wheel and placing a dolly under each. Once the dollies were in place the team began to push the car away from the middle of the autocross track. The rough surfaces made the move particularly tough and one of the dollies caught on gravel and fell away. The team was still able to get the car moved using just the three dollies. Then they turned their attention to a Mercedes SUV that was in the Funkhana course.



I did see the lady that owned the Mercedes come and get her car; she said nothing, just got in and drove away, but I had to wonder what she was thinking about the placement of her car and how it got there.



Once that was all cleared up, then the racing could commence. We saw the Cone Bandit making an appearance after 10 years, she was back. Different car, same assault on a poor cone, drug it a good 200 ft. This one, while not tangled up in the suspension of the TR6, was tightly caught under the TR7, took two people to pull it out.

Seems like there should be a new award category for stealing cones.



THEY'RE ALL WORKS IN PROGRESS

Rich Etz—Rich's Triumph has a fuel pump problem, he'd hoped it was a problem with the fuel filter. He hasn't worked on the car much yet, hopes to get to it soon but right now the main effort is fixing his "cruising machine" (presumably his '72 Corvette). Also, he's been helping neighbors who sustained damage from May's tornado.

YFE—No major updates; still need to replace the vacuum brake assist, change the oil, plugs and plug wires.

Sam Sheppard—Graduation on Saturday (applause!), have a slow leak with the yellow Spitfire affecting the idle. Otherwise, am working on reorganizing the garage so they can work on the other car.

Glenn Frasca—Working on an overheating issue. Recently bought an MG Midget, reasonably priced, I successfully resisted buying it for five days. The Midget's a '73, prepared for autocrossing, it has a supercharged 1275 plus a five-speed Datsun transmission.

Ed Kaizer—Not working on anything right now, have a lot that needs doing including bodywork on the TR6, solving the starting issues. (verbal troubleshooting by the group followed). Stephen Paur retold the tale of the world record backfire generated by Ed's TR6 during the fall colours drive some years back. Ed rsp: "I got an award!" the discussion segued into the value of keeping hammers in your Triumph. Rsp: "It's important to have a hammer, but don't get hammered."

Stephen L. Paur—Put BlueTooth in the TR6. For years, he wanted to put in an spin-on oil filter adaptor, bought one from JS Motorsports, "it's brilliant!" Installation was easy, the adaptor's a bit pricey, \$180 to \$250. Discussion followed on filter installation (NOTE: see "TR Tech," pg 10, this issue)

Pat Kasate—Still have a TR3 in the garage..."I'm in a dream state, it doesn't run, not currently." Rsp: "did it run when parked?" Rsp2: "You could light a fire under it. Rsp3: "Do you need an intervention?

Ben Franklin—"I actually did something" (gasps from the crowd): "I changed the steering wheel" (applause). Motolite, 13-inch, was a gift, very nice. Next up, during Sunday's drive, noted a squeak when turning left, could be a bearing or bushing. Rsp: "Just turn the radio up." Rsp2: "Stop making left turns."

John Moore—Finally decided to pull out the old speed-ometer on the TR6, David Yannayon very graciously provided a replacement; "they are a bear to get in" (Dave Massey: "You've gotta be a contortionist." The TR3's sitting, waiting for a steering wheel (everyone immediately looked at Ben; Jesse commented, "I know where you can get one"). Other than that, John's working on his BMW Z4: "I remodeled the front end." Rsp: "How big was the deer?"

Jesse Lowe—Hasn't been working on cars lately.

John Willerton—Used leather cleaner on the interior of his TR3, "it shined up pretty good."

Creig Houghtaling—Got a new transmission to install in "The Monster," he and Dave would do the job the next day.

Mike Lewis—Working on the gearbox of the '72 TR6, the engine's in the car right now.

Dave Massey—Haven't done any work on the TR6, did change the oil prior to the trip to Waco, Also worked on the pressure regulator for the fuel system, hot starting issues. Has a bunch of ideas on what to do. As for the TR8, it remains a work in progress...running great but it has what they call coil on plug, where each plug has a coil. He's working up a sensor so he can monitor sequential firing and "spark events." Rsp from the floor: "Man, that is way over my head."

Dave: "That's the beauty of the hobby. You can focus on mechanical stuff or you can focus on the systems. There has been a lot of progress in engine management systems over the last 45 years.

road/parking lot in front of the Armed Forces Recruiting Center.

Quickly learned a valuable lesson: steering and stopping a one-ton vehicle going (slightly) downhill from outside the vehicle – ie, left side, right hand on the steering wheel – particularly a car with power steering that isn't functioning because the engine's off, is damn near impossible. Despite my best efforts, BOOM, up and over the curb in front of the recruiting center. Well, at least that stopped the car and there was no immediate indication of serious damage, no oil dump although I have to wonder how the under-bumper spoiler managed to remain attached the vehicle.

About the time I succeeded in getting the car off the curb, two good Samaritans jumped out of their vehicles, ran over and said "get in and steer, we'll push you!' Flailed a bit getting into the driver's seat while the car was moving, fortunately I didn't fall under the wheels (that would have truly marked the end of the perfect day, eh? The headline in *Exhaust Notes* would've probably been "Editor run over by own Triumph"), but God love 'em, we got the TR8 safely off Manchester and parked. Phew...

So now the Wedge sits in the garage, awaiting the initial trouble-shooting session with a panel of experts. My guess is that it's a fuel feed issue, perhaps a failed fuel pump or clogged fuel filter. We'll see...

BTW, this is the first time I've had to get the car towed in several years, probably since "the great radiator failure" event at one of the Boeing autocrosses. I can't complain...I am thankful that with help I was able to get the dead vehicle off one of the busiest roads in the region and am thankful we have the expertise in SLTOA to help me get it back on the road and track.
